

Hedgehogs Learning Journey

Summer term: Movers and Shakers

'Movers and Shakers' is this term's driver project. This project teaches children about historically significant people who have had a major impact on the world. They will learn to use timelines, stories and historical sources to find out about the people featured and use historical models to explore their significance. To compliment this learning journey, the children will complete mini projects that address the other areas of the curriculum.

Mini projects

Summer 1

RE	Our key questions this half term is 'Who is a Muslim and how do they live?'
Still life	This art project teaches the children about the work of significant still life artists and still life techniques. They explore a wide variety of still lifes and learn about the use of colour and composition. They create still life arrangements and artwork.
RSE	We will be looking at the theme 'Health and Wellbeing'. We will focus on hygiene, the process of growing from young to old and the main body parts.

Summer 2

RE	Our key questions this half term is 'What makes some places special to believers?'
Plants (part 2)	We will learn how plants begin life and what they need to grow well. We will explore a range of seeds and bulbs, finding out how each one starts to grow through germination. Children will observe plants over time, compare different types of plant, and investigate the conditions plants need to stay healthy
Remarkable recipes	This DT project teaches children about sources of food and tools used for food preparation. They also discover why some foods are cooked and learn to read a simple recipe. The children choose and make a new school meal that fulfils specific design criteria.



Maths

Year 1	We will be looking at finding $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{4}$ of shapes and quantities, learning to tell the time to the hour and half past and then developing of understanding of numbers to 100.
Year 2	We will continue to look at 2D and 3D shapes, focusing on naming them and knowing their properties. Then we will focus on telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes and solving time word problems

Home learning Project

Your challenge is to create a piece of work about a significant person that interests you. You could create a poster, a presentation, a still life drawing or model of your individual as well as your opinion about their significance and impact on the world. Let's get started!
