Autumn Term 1: Invasion

This project teaches children about life in Britain after the Roman withdrawal. Children will learn about Anglo-Saxon and Viking invasions up to the Norman conquest.

Mini projects

Autumn 1

Science	Animals including Humans – Teeth and Digestion In this unit, children will learn about the importance of the digestive system and the name of each part of the system. They will identify the different types of teeth, their purpose and how to look after their teeth.
RE	Hinduism In this unit children will learn about the concept of 'Gospel' and how Christians today try to follow Jesus.
Art	Warp and Weft This project teaches children about the artform of weaving and how it has developed over time,
Computing	Email This unit allows children to explore electronic communication using 2Email. Children learn how to respond to, compose and add attachments to emails as well as consider the safety aspects of email communication.
Music	MAMMA MIA! As well as learning to sing, play, improvise and compose with the well known song Mamma Mia, children will listen and appraise more ABBA hits in this unit.
People skills	Safety First In this unit, children will learn how to recognise their growing independence, what responsibilities they have and how to avoid risks, hazards and dangers they may encounter in all areas of their lives.



Maths

This half term, we will be focusing on place value and addition and subtraction. We will focus on the place value of each digit in numbers up to 10,000. We will focus on mental addition and subtraction strategies.

Home learning Project

This half term we would like the children to create either an Anglo-Saxon longhouse or Viking longship. This can be done in any media you would like to choose! This could be a labelled drawing on paper, a model made from any resources you have around the house, painted or even with baked goods!
